Despite its long-standing reputation, there are fantastic examples of bone-dry Riesling that will absolutely convert thirsty sceptics.

## The Whites

### Not always sweet, but not crisp either

Rather than showcase a broad 'aromatic' section, these wines each offer the palate a little extra compared to the "crisp dry" requests. A few years' bottle ageing for some have produced subtle to not so subtle honeyed notes. On occasion, proper oak-barrel fermentation imparts complex texture and savoury notes of baking spices. Some grapes like Gewürztraminer, with its famously ginger-spiced and lychee fruitiness, tend to be fermented with a kiss of residual sugar to really complement any dishes with spiciness.

#### ***A little unfamiliar, but worth the try***

Outside of Champagne there are uncommon examples of *Blanc de Noir* style, and even more rarely as a still wine. But Terrazze Dell'Etna, from the ash of the live volcano in Sicily, produces a number of amazing wines, not least of all this mineral-driven white from the red berries of **Nerello Mascalese**.

Immediately removing the grape skins once fermentation begins leaves the wine without red pigmentation and tannic grip, but allows the aromas of rosemary and tropical fruit to blossom in the glass. A delightful suggestion with white meats and particularly seafood.

It is not always time for big bold reds. Perhaps you fancy a pleasant, thirst-quenching *vin de soif* to begin your relaxing stay with us. Or something to balance your delicate canapés before dinner. Pinot Noir is the classic favourite, as is its less serious cousin Gamay, famously of the Beaujolais region.

### Something new in the Cellar

Though famous for white wines such as Riesling, light, food-friendly reds are increasingly showcased as well. **Spätburgunder** is the German name for Pinot Noir; same grape varietal, different place. With winemaking experience from his time in South Africa, California, and Romania, Jürgen Hoffman took over his family farm in 1998, converting to vineyards from mixed agriculture.

From Germany's largest winemaking region, Rheinhessen, limestone-rich soils help maintain refreshing acidity in the grapes, and 16 months maturation in French oak barrels complement the supple tannins.

### Match up for Mealtime

It is these instances one tends to reach for a red that has a bit of weight with herbal or spicy notes, so it's no surprise that different combinations of Syrah, Carignan, Grenache, and Mourvedre feature.
